Good day to you. I don't think I have ever heard of an issue that so galvanised the public into action or held the perpetrators up to ridicule more than the Black Swan Lake matter. I believe the current CCC investigation will ultimately reveal significant conflicts of interest by some Councillors regarding this matter and the alleged improper way they and the administration have conducted themselves. I believe there is far more to all this than meets the eye and for all we know the plan is to gift it to the Turf Club once all the hullabaloo dies away. By the way, the deputy mayor Donna Gates was a made a director of the Turf Club in 2017 and in the same year apparently acquired shares in a race horse but, has she placed it on the Council Register of Interest?

The people organising the fight for Black Swan Lake are true heroes in my book and include Sally Spain from Wildlife Queensland and Tammy Hogan from the Black Swan Lake Alliance (BSA). As well, let's not forget all the wonderful people who regularly keep watch on the site and all those who have called and objected or written letters and provided funds to fight the case, God bless you all. Black Swan Lake will be won and justice for the wild life will be achieved and hopefully real democracy will return to a wayward Council.
